

## **AFRICAN DEMOCRACY PROJECT: Botswana**

On March 10 through 21, 2011, 13 university scholars engaged Batswana of all walks of life on a variety of topics. Students examined democratic institutions in Botswana, emphasizing HIV/AIDS care and counseling, gender equality, sustainable energy development, and the challenges of life in Africa in a turbulent, globalizing world. Beginning in Gaborone, the capital of Botswana, students traveled through the country with Dr. Reid and co-instructor Xavier Livermon in order to gain perspectives on rural Botswana. Students filmed and journaled, not only their interviews, but also their own experiences in adapting to Botswanan life and their own reflections on the experience.

Xavier Livermon received his B.A. in Political Science from UC San Diego, and his M.A. and Ph.D. in African

Diaspora Studies at UC Berkeley. His dissertation, entitled "Kwaito Bodies in African Diaspora Space: The Politics of Popular Music in Post-Apartheid South Africa" examines how popular performance cultures in post-apartheid South Africa are shaped by Afrodiasporic consciousness as well as the effect these popular performance cultures have on rapidly changing sociopolitical circumstances in contemporary South Africa. His research interests include examining the role of Africa in African Diaspora Studies, gender and sexuality in the African Diaspora, Black Cultural Studies, and Music and Performance cultures of the African Diaspora. From 2006-2008 he was a postdoctoral fellow in the Department of Communication Studies at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill.
